



**Corps Colours**, which form the basis of regimental ties, flags, stable belts, etc, are, in sequence and proportion:

**Blue (Navy blue shade) 4 Parts**

Marks intimate connections with the Royal Navy and blue was the colour of uniform facing for over 100 years.

**Yellow (Old gold shade) 1 Part**

Distinctive colour of dress and ensigns of the Duke of York and Albany's Maritime Regiment of Foot.

**Green (Light Infantry green shade) 1 Part**

Originally worn on shako by infantry of the Corps and perpetuated in bugle strings of the RMLI.

**Red (Red drummer shade) 2 Parts**

Historic colour of British Army and worn by the infantry of the Corps from the earliest times.

**Blue — 4 Parts** (as above).
